SCHOOL PROCEDURES & POLICIES

SCHOOL OFFICE HOURS

The Cosumnes River Elementary School office is open **Monday—Friday from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm**. Student supervision begins at 7:30 am where students may enter the campus and line-up near their classrooms or go to the cafeteria for breakfast.

PARENT-TEACHER COMMUNICATION

We value our parents and want to communicate with you as much as necessary. Our first priority, however, is to see that student learning is not interrupted during the day. If you wish to speak to your child's teacher, please email, send a note with your child, or leave a message with the office staff and the teacher will make contact with you as soon as possible. If you would like homework for your absent child, please email the teacher.

VISITORS & VOLUNTEERS

We welcome and encourage parents to visit and volunteer in their children's classrooms. All visitors and volunteers must, however, make prior arrangements with the teacher and be cleared through fingerprinting. When you arrive, please check in at the office where you will receive a visitor badge. We also ask that you notify the teacher at least 24 hours in advance if you intend to provide an edible treat for a birthday celebration in case alternative arrangements need to be arranged for a classmate with dietary restrictions.

PARENTVUE (Synergy)

ParentVUE is EGUSD's student information system which allows parents to access near real-time information on assignments and scores, attendance, and demographic information. BREAKFAST & LUNCH

Breakfast is served from 7:30 am—7:45 am. Currently all meals are provided for all EGUSD students. We will notify parents if any changes to this occur

ATTENDANCE

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss school—regardless of the reason—it can cause them to fall behind academically. Vacations during the regular school year are discouraged and teachers are not required to provide assignments or assessments for students with unexcused absences. Children chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade, and by 6th grade. Chronic absence is a predictor for dropping out of school. If an absence is necessary, please call, email, or send a note with your child including the date and reason for the absence. Students will be marked tardy if they are not in their classrooms by 7:50 am.

TRAFFIC & PARKING

Traffic flow and existing parking are minor challenges we face at Cosumnes River Elementary. We strongly encourage families to utilize bus transportation or car pool to avoid the long line of cars waiting to enter campus before school and around dismissal time. Safety is our number one concern and it requires respect and responsibility on everyone's part.

- Do not park in handicapped spots without a placard nor in red emergency zones.
- Children may only cross the crosswalk with an adult during arrival and dismissal. Always use the crosswalk please!
- Please do not EVER allow your child to cross lanes to be dropped off or picked up.
- When picking up or dropping off your child(ren), please pull forward of the crosswalk (2-3 cars can fit) to expedite the process.
- Please concentrate on driving and avoid the distraction of an electronic device.
- During events when we are parking on the blacktop/playground, please drive slowly and follow the parking pattern (do not block anyone vehicles from exiting).

HEALTH & MEDICAL INFORMATION

HEAD LICE POLICY

Head lice are tiny bugs that live on the hair and scalp. They are transmitted from one person to another by direct contact or on shared combs, hair brushes, hats, etc. They can also be acquired from upholstered furniture, clothing and bedding. Head lice cannot hop or jump.

If a child is found to have head lice:

1. The child's parent(s) will be notified and provided information about the treatment of head lice.
2. A student may return to school after the first treatment if no active lice is found. All returning students must be checked and cleared by the office before going to class.

Our district's head lice policy/procedure is in line with evidence based practice and is based on the recommendation from the CDC, Sac County Public Health, American Academy of Pediatrics, and National Association of Nurses.

HEALTH AND NURSING SERVICES

The nursing services at CRES are administered by a qualified school nurse once a week. The following services are provided: vision and hearing screening, updating medical information, keeping appropriate records for students, providing nutritional and dental health education, and acting as a resource for our staff and parents.

IMMUNIZATIONS AND HEALTH EXAMS

Immunizations are required by law and will be verified at the time of registration. A TDaP booster after the seventh birthday is required for entry to middle school.

For first grade entry, all families must provide the district with written evidence of physical examination completed no sooner than 18 months prior to first grade entry but no later than 3 months after first grade entry. The law also now requires that children have an oral health assessment by May 31 in kindergarten or first grade—whichever is their first year of public school.



MEDICATION

Any student who is required to take, during the regular school day, medication (either prescription or non-prescription) must have an updated "Administration of Medication by School Personnel" form on file in the office.

All student medication must be in the original container, clearly labeled with the student's name and will be kept securely locked in the nurse's office. Students may not carry medication on their person; exceptions require physician, parent and principal authorization.



COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

ENGLISH LEARNER ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The ELAC meets once every trimester to discuss educational issues relative to students who are English Learners (ELs). During those meetings, input and feedback are solicited to develop site Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) goals. Translators are available during these meetings. We welcome all parents to attend.

SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL (SSC)

The primary role of the SSC is to assist in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of our school's Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). The council is composed of staff members and parents who serve two year terms. Meetings are held throughout the year.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION

Our PTA is a vital part of CRES and continues to provide opportunities to build connections among families, socialize at sponsored events, and fundraise at school activities to enrich the lives of students and families. CURRICULUM

TEXTBOOKS

Students will be issued textbooks for those content areas which the district has adopted texts. Your child is individually responsible for these books for the school year. If a book is lost or damaged, you will be billed for the partial or full price of the book depending on the condition of the book when it was issued. In order to ensure that our textbooks stay in good condition, it is recommended that all non-consumable texts should be covered during the first week of school.

LANGUAGE ARTS

California Wonders is the adopted ELA program in EGUSD which integrates reading, writing, spelling, listening, and speaking. Classroom teachers also use social studies and science textbooks, short stories, poetry, plays, essays, biographies and novels to help all students achieve grade level Common Core Standards. The “*ConnectEd*” website linked to California Wonders is helpful to both parents and students. A link appears on our website and in the Student Portal.

MATHEMATICS

In EGUSD K-6 classrooms, teachers will be implementing Common Core Standards using *Go Math* curriculum. The *Go Math* materials are teacher, parent, and student “friendly” and the “*Think Central*” website linked to *Go Math* is helpful to both parents and students. A link appears on our website and in the Student Portal.

SCIENCE

Our adopted standards-based science curriculum is *California Science* (K-5) and *Earth Science* (6th). As we implement CCSS, this curriculum will provide students more opportunities to read and understand informational text. State science standards are assessed annually as part of 5th grade CAASPP testing. The Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) will be implemented this school year and *Mysteries of Science* will be an additional curriculum teachers can utilize.


SOCIAL SCIENCE

The K-6 History/Social Science program in the Elk Grove Unified School District is standards-based with an emphasis on both subject-area content and historical and social science analysis skills. The K-6 curriculum (McGraw-Hill Education) contains strategies for writing, note-taking, critical thinking, vocabulary development, and building success in comprehending expository text. Primary source materials, both written and through media, are included to enhance student engagement in learning about people and events of the past.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students in grades 1-6 will receive 100 minutes per week of physical education. For students to be excused from PE activities, a note from the parent or doctor detailing limitations (as well as what the student can participate in) is required. 5th grade students will participate in a state-required Physical Fitness Test in the spring.

COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

Our students receive weekly instruction in computer-related skills which adhere to the EGUSD technology standards. The goal is for all students to have a minimum competency in basic operations and concepts, understand social, ethical, and human issues related to technology, and be able to use productivity tools.

FIELD TRIPS

Field trips are planned to enhance and coordinate with our curriculum. Only district-approved transportation will be used for trips. If, for any reason, a scheduled field trip does not have the sufficient number of chaperones, the field trip may be canceled. Chaperones will continue to need fingerprint (DOJ) clearance and Mandated Reporter Training. **Students must return correctly completed forms by the deadlines.**

SCHOOL PROGRAMS & SERVICES

LIBRARY

CRES has a well-stocked library containing hundreds of fiction, nonfiction and reference books. We also offer two Scholastic Book Fairs (fall and spring) for families and teachers. Profits from the book fairs supplementally fund our library program.

LEARNING CENTER

Our Learning Center supports our students with special needs with both “push-in” and “pull-out” services based on their individualized educational plans (IEPs). Additionally, our Learning Center staff provides expertise to classroom teachers and administration regarding research-based strategies for teaching all students.

STUDENT STUDY TEAM & 504 TEAM

These teams are effective resources with the purpose of supporting students. The teams meet at the request of the parent/guardian or classroom teacher, and are often composed of the parents/guardians, classroom teacher, administrator, and often our Education Specialist, school psychologist, counselor, nurse, and speech/language therapist. The team meets to study, discuss, and decide about appropriate interventions for:

- Students with possible learning difficulties,
- Students who have or may need a 504,
- Students in need of behavior supports,
- Students who have been recommended for retention or acceleration, and
- Students who have been recommended for acceleration beyond their grade level.

EXTENDED DAY OPPORTUNITIES

- Our **Cross Country, Track & Field, and Runnin’ for Rhett Clubs** are coordinated and supervised by our classroom teachers and parent/community volunteers. Permission and field trip forms completed by parents/guardians need to be on file for students to participate in this after school club.
- Our **EGUSD Volleyball** program is coordinated and supervised by parent/community volunteers. Permission forms completed by parents/guardians need to be on file for

students to participate in this after school club.

- We are partnering with **The Young Rembrandts** on Thursday afternoons during Early Out Thursdays (EOTs) so our bus riders can participate as well.
- Depending on resources (coordinator and parent coaches), CRES may participate in the EGUSD **Basketball** program for 5th and 6th grade boys and girls.
- Our **Summer School** provides extended learning opportunities for our students who have not yet met standards in ELA and mathematics and enrichment activities to balance the program.

K-KIDS

Students in fifth and sixth grade comprise the K-Kids Team sponsored by the Kiwanis and advised by teachers. These CRES students provide leadership through community service. These students typically meet during their lunchtime to plan and prepare projects related to their goals.

Golden CRES Award

The Golden CRES is the highest award that a student can attain during their time at Cosumnes River Elementary School. This award is earned by demonstrating prolonged success in academics, extra-curricular activities, and community service. This program starts in 5th grade and students who earn their Golden CRES are awarded at the end of their 6th grade year.

INCENTIVES

We make an effort to acknowledge positive behavior with programs such as:

- Our **Golden Lunchbox** where students earn an extra recess on Fridays for exemplary behavior in the cafeteria,
- **Beep Beep Bucks** that students earn from staff members which are collected in class and can earn a treats.
- Coupons for free items for improved attendance, opportunity to win a raffled bicycle at the end of the year, and monthly classroom privileges/treats for the class that has the most days of "on time" attendance,
- **"Family Beep Beep Bucks"** for parents or guardians who show respectful and responsible behaviors that are entered into a random drawing.
- Monthly **"PBIS RRR" assemblies** recognizing students in each classroom for Respectful, Responsible, Ready to Learn behavior.



STUDENT BEHAVIOR

RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE & READY TO LEARN

Our goal at CRES is for all students to be respectful, responsible and ready to learn at all times. PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports) is a framework for establishing a positive learning environment for all students.

At Cosumnes River Elementary School, we

- have defined positive social expectations for all areas of our campus,
- teach our expectations for all areas of our campus,
- acknowledge the positive behavior of students, staff and parents,
- have a behavior referral process for those students who do not follow our expectations,
- use behavior referral data to determine consequences, and provide supports and interventions to individual and small groups of students.

MINOR AND MAJOR BEHAVIOR

REFERRALS

Sometimes, even with direct teaching of our rules, students still might not meet our behavior expectations. Your child may receive a minor behavior referral to his/her classroom teacher or s/he may receive a major behavior referral to administration. Families will be contacted at this time to enlist additional support. Our goal is always to help a student learn from his or her behavior, and to successfully return to the classroom and to learning.

DRESS CODE & GUIDELINES

All Elk Grove students are expected to wear appropriate clothing at all times. Students need to wear clothing and footwear that are safe, conducive to PE or recess activities, and are not distracting to instruction or offensive to the school community. There are no flip flop or other sandal type shoes allowed at school unless they are close toed and have a way to attach around the heels. If a child is dressed inappropriately, the office will call the parent/guardian to bring a change of clothing to school if necessary.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Please leave toys, spinners/fidgets, cameras, iPods, games, and trading cards at home as they can create problems of distraction, loss and damage. School staff does not take responsibility for lost, stolen, or damaged personal property.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR
CELL PHONES



If a family chooses to send a student to school with a cell phone, the following rules apply:

- Cell phone needs to be turned off and put into the student’s backpack as soon as s/he steps onto campus.
- Cell phones should not be taken out in class or brought out to recess or lunch.
- The cell phone may be confiscated by administration if it is disrupting the learning environment. Parents will be notified and asked to pick up the phone from the office.
- Staff members will not take responsibility for lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Respectful and responsible behavior on the bus is expected whether waiting for a bus, going to or from a bus stop, or on a field trip.

In part, students must:

- Obey the request of the bus operator, give proper identification when requested,
- Avoid all fighting and rough play while at the bus stop, on the bus, or when getting on or off the bus,
- Always respect the rights and property of others on the bus and at the bus stop,
- Remain seated, facing forward with feet, legs and other objects clear of the aisle,
- Not use profane language, obscene gestures, create excessive or unnecessary noise,
- Not damage/deface bus or endanger the safety of others, and,
- Not eat/drink on the bus or throw any objects inside or outside of the bus.

The bus driver or administration will issue citations if the rules are not followed. The consequences for violating any rules are as follows:

- 1st = Conference with principal and notification to parent
- 2nd = One day suspension from riding bus and notification to parent

BUS TRANSPORTATION (continued)

- 3rd = Five day suspension from riding the bus and notification to the parent
- 4th = Ten day suspension from riding the bus and notification to the parent
- 5th = Permanent suspension for remainder of school year & parent notification
